

Honokaa Business Association Evelyn Andrade 2020 Scholarships

The Honokaa Business Association (HBA) announces the availability of multiple Evelyn Andrade Scholarships available for Honokaa High School and Laupahoehoe Community Public Charter School (LCPCS) graduating seniors. Scholarships will be awarded to students pursuing further education. All scholarships will be paid directly to the awardees once proof of enrollment has been submitted to the scholarship committee. Awardees will be notified directly in early May, and Honoka'a students will be recognized at the annual Honoka'a Scholarship Awards Ceremony in May.

The Honokaa Business Association is a volunteer organization of business owners and individuals dedicated to boosting the vitality and productivity of Honokaa and Hamakua as a whole. Our cooperative aims to improve the economic prosperity of the region by focusing on appreciation of the cultural and natural resources of the area and providing a local support network to empower the community's well-being.

Eligibility:

- Graduating Honokaa High School or LCPCS senior.
- Accepted to an accredited 2-year or 4-year institution or recognized certification program or an apprenticeship program*.
- Minimum cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.5.

Requirements:

- In an essay of between 250 and 500 words describe your dreams for continuing your education. Be sure to include supporting details relating to your past accomplishments and/or service to others, current motivations and future plans.
- How do you intend to fund your education? Please explain in 50-100 words.
- Provide one signed letter of recommendation. This letter must be submitted as part of your application packet. The letter may be written by anyone that is not a relative of the applicant. Examples include a teacher, employer or a community member who knows you. Please include contact information for the person. Please do not have letters sent directly to the HBA.
- Optional, but highly recommended: provide a sample of your work, along with a brief description of how it relates to your interests. This can include original work done by the applicant in written, digital or other forms. Submissions can include, but are not limited to, artwork, musical recordings, video, past school projects, poetry etc. Photo evidence of the work is acceptable.
- Applications may be dropped off at HHIS at the College and Career Center with Ms. Richards **or** submitted via US Postal Service mail. If using the US Postal Service, please send the completed application to:
